The project – urban spaces of possibilities for sustainable futures

- Interdisciplinary research "City As A Space of Possibility " (2015 to 2018)
- The project idea was developed by scientists of Leuphana University of Lüneburg, financed by the Lower-Saxonian Ministry of Culture & VW Foundation
- Four research groups/ three different faculties at Leuphana; from the fields of culture and the city (Kirchberg), arts and sustainability (Kagan), education for sustainable development (Stoltenberg) and innovation management (Weisenfeld).

Research questions

- How do actors cooperate with each other and with the institutions of the city with respect of sustainable urban development?
- Which urban networks strengthen and weaken the implementation of sustainable urban development?
- What kind of power and dependency relationships exist?

specific question: To what extent are artistic and cultural initiatives and projects important for sustainable urban development, also compared to other areas?

...and for the future: How can stakeholder networks (especially in arts and culture) be strengthened and thereby promote sustainable urban development in Hanover?

Network analysis – research design


- Case study: Hanover (capital of Lower Saxony)
- (Quantitative) Network analysis: A personalized survey link with the invitation to participate in the study was sent at the end of August 2017 to a total of 164 representatives of organizations and projects related to sustainable urban development in Hanover. 61 persons completed the questionnaire, 56 of which complete with details of their contacts.
- (Qualitative) network analysis: **Workshop** (group discussion) with main actors of sustainable urban development in February 2018. Presentation and **reflection of first quantitative findings**.

Network Survey: Name Generator


• For the purpose of finding network actors in Hanover, the following question was formulated:

"In your everyday life you exchange information with other actors to achieve the goals and tasks of your project / your organization. If you think back from the beginning of 2016 to today: Who did you interact with?"


• Then, the respondents could scroll through the list on the computer screen, and click on all the actors with whom they had an exchange during this period. A total of 56 of the 61 respondents responded to this stimulus, citing 1,217 contacts.




Connectivity according to types of projects



Communities (subnetworks) according to types of projects




Impulses for the establishment of cooperative relations




Reasons (motivation) for cooperation




Resources that are exchanged in cooperation relationships
